2010-2011 VBC ENROLLMENT FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Question: Who should think about attending Victory Bible College (VBC)?

Answer: You...if you have a Fivefold Ministry call of God on your life.
You...if you're currently a leader in ministry and desire to further develop your personal leadership skills.
You...if you have a strong passion not only to work, but to be a leader in the ministry.

Question: Are there any qualifications or requirements for attending VBC?

Answer: Yes, you must be 18 years of age, a born again believer, an active member of VCMII (MD, VA, or DC) or one of our approved affiliate churches. Also, you must have completed the New Covenant Partner's class **before** submitting an VBC application.

Question: I'm not a member of VCMII; does this mean I can't attend VBC?

Answer: No. Non-VCMII members are considered for VBC enrollment, but with limited admission. This is approved on an individual case basis. A non-VCMII member requires a minimum of two years active membership within his/her home church, and must submit a reference letter approved and signed by your Pastor. The VBC Administrator and Director will review the reference letter and your application. You will be notified of your application status prior to Orientation Day.

Question: I did not finish Partner's class after I became a new member many years ago. Will I be required to complete Partner's class before attending VBC?

Answer: Completing the New Partner's class is a prerequisite before enrolling in VBC. While there may have been an instance where a member has been granted admission to VBC after having only partially completed Partner's class, this is extremely rare. The VBC Administrator and Director will review and approve such cases individually. Please contact a VBC advisor for further guidance.

Question: Will I have another opportunity to enroll later in the school year if I'm unable to register during the enrollment period?

Answer: No, currently there is only one open enrollment period per year. However, if transportation, job, family, or a medical issue prevents you from registering, please speak with an VBC advisor or the Director before making your decision.

Question: When and where is orientation?

Answer: In the VCMII-MD main sanctuary on August 21, 2010 at 10:00 am (Students)
Registration lines will open at 7:30am for student needing to register.

Question: When is the first day of classes?

Answer: August 28, 2010; you should arrive promptly at 8:00am and be prepared to participate in prayer with your classmates.

Question: How much is tuition and other fees?

Answer: One-time Non-Refundable registration fee - \$50.00
Full time tuition (4 courses) - TBD
Part time tuition (1-3 courses) - TBD
Course materials are priced separately.

Question: What is the schedule for classes?

Answer: TENTATIVE
The school year consists of four quarters (four eight week sessions)
Classes are held each Saturday from 9:00 am - 2:30 pm
Corporate prayer with your class begins promptly at 8:00 am
There is a 10-minute break between classes
There is a 30-minute break from 11:30 am to 12:00 pm

Question: Is there provision for childcare?

Answer: No, not at this time. Students are responsible for making their own arrangements.

Question: Who is eligible to enroll for the new third year of study?

Answer: All two-year VBC graduates are eligible to enroll for the third year, regardless of when they completed the program.

Question: After successfully completing the three-year VBC academic program, will I receive a degree?

Answer: Absolutely! Effective with the 2009/2010 academic school year, a three-year Associates Degree in Christian Studies will be conferred upon those students who successfully complete the additional third year of training.

Question: Is there also a degree awarded for completing the two-year program?

Answer: No, not at this time. Students completing two years of academic study will receive a two-year Diploma.

Question: Now that VBC is granting a degree, does this mean it is an accredited institution?

Answer: Not yet! State exemption does not mean accreditation. While VCMI VBC can grant degrees solely in religious studies, we are still actively in the process of obtaining full accreditation.
